Saturday Morning Prayer 25/3/23

The prayer morning focussed on two main aspects the path that God has and is leading us on and how he has, and is blessing us.

1) <u>The Path</u>



We read - Psalm 77:11-20 NLT

¹¹ But then I recall all you have done, O LORD;

I remember your wonderful deeds of long ago.

¹² They are constantly in my thoughts. I cannot stop thinking about your mighty works.

¹³ O God, your ways are holy. Is there any god as mighty as you?

¹⁴ You are the God of great wonders!

You demonstrate your awesome power among the nations.

¹⁵ By your strong arm, you redeemed your people,

(...)¹⁶ When the Red Sea saw you, O God, its waters looked and trembled!

 (\dots) ¹⁹ Your road led through the sea, your pathway through the mighty waters—

a pathway no one knew was there!

²⁰ You led your people along that road like a flock of sheep,

with Moses and Aaron as their shepherds.

People went away for 20 minutes for private reflections and then came back and shared.

- His footsteps are not seen. A number of people picked up on this and shared various thoughts
 - Look up. He holds our hands (Is. 41)
 - The sea would have been the last place they wanted to go into, but God led them in and through like a flock. But he led them through human leaders. Through two human leaders, Moses and Aaron.
 - The sea wasn't the obvious choice Someone had shared a prophetic word with the leadership just before our retreat – ""It was not to focus on the first thing that comes to you but rather wait for the latter thoughts, which may be more unusual or not appear so big but could be the best path for the church."
 - $\circ~$ God's ways are not our ways. God's thoughts are not our thoughts.
 - A number were drawn to the picture of the path/road that is on the lounge wall
- Moses went up onto Mt. Nebo to view the Promised land ahead (Although he himself never got to enter) Deut. 32:48-52
- Look at the way you have come, how I blessed you. One person shared some photos they had from our previous premises in Gold St. and the people meeting there.
- But we remembered it's not the building it's the relationships, the community.
- We need to see the gospel in fresh ways.
- Another person shared that we have to both look at the way he has brought us, his blessings, mighty works, but also forget the former things, he is doing a new thing. Each Sunday God does new things. Each Sunday, in some ways. It is a new church. And God speaks fresh words Remarkably this was one of the readings we were just about to have from Is. 43 (see below)
- Remember God's deeds, and miracles and referred to the old song "Count your blessings name them one by one" Jonathan shared that remarkably that is exactly what we were going to do in the next session, and the song had been in his mind when he prepared it.

We read - Psalm 25:4-7

⁴ Show me the right path, O LORD; point out the road for me to follow.

(...) All day long I put my hope in you.

⁶ Remember, O LORD, your compassion and unfailing love,

which you have shown from long ages past.

⁷ Do not remember the rebellious sins of my youth.
